All contacts concerning our insurance are to be made through our property manager, David Robbins.

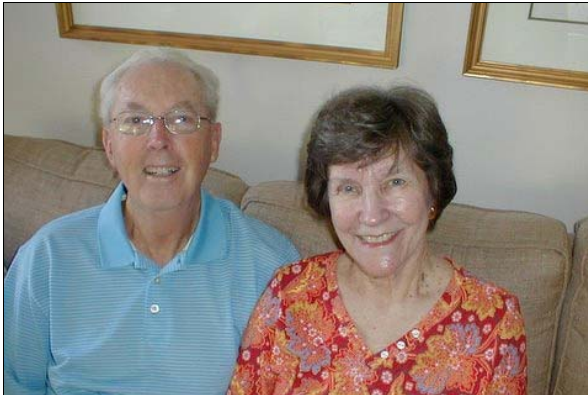

Don is in transition. He is selling the country house that he designed and shared with his wife, who died three years ago.

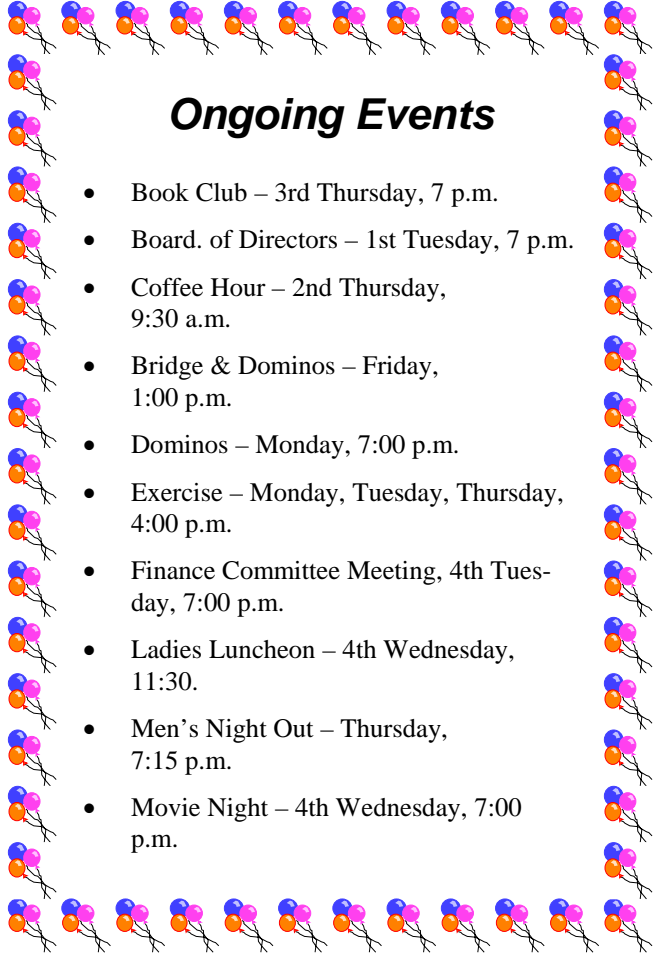

What Is a Spiedie?

On Monday, September 6, we will have a pool-closing social during which we will serve spiedies. See *Save the Date*, below, for more details about the social.

The **spiedie** (pronounce speedy) is a dish known and enjoyed throughout central New York state.

Spiedie consists of cubes of chicken or pork, but it may also be made from lamb, veal, venison or beef. The meat cubes are marinated overnight or longer (sometimes for as long as two weeks under a controlled environment) in a special marinade, then grilled carefully on spits (if steel skewers are used, they are called "spiedie rods") over a charcoal pit.

The freshly prepared cubes are served on soft Italian bread or a submarine roll and skewer. It is sometimes drizzled with fresh marinade. The bread is used as an oven glove to grip the meat while the skewer is removed.



Spiedie meat cubes can also be eaten straight off the skewer or can be served in salads, stir fries, and a number of other dishes. The

marinade recipe varies, usually involving olive oil, vinegar, and a variety of Italian spices and fresh mint.

The original idea for spiedie was brought by Italian immigrants to Upstate New York in the early 1920s. The term "spiedie" comes from the Italian "spiedo" meaning spit or "spiedini" referring to cubes or balls of meat cooked on a skewer.

- Lock gates to pool area. Check BBQ grill for gas shut-off. (In season)
- Turn off all TVs and appliances. Set thermostats at 78 for A/C, 64 for heat.
- Check all doors and windows to be sure they are locked.
- Check 3 lamps on timers to be sure they are operating.
- Test motion lights at front and poolside of clubhouse.
- Turn on outside entrance lights at front door and exercise room door.
- Lock front door when you leave.
- If you encounter intruders or vandalism, call police at 911 or 469-4016
