# Landscape Update - chair Nancy Coderre

- 1. Capital Project Replace the 3 Streetlights in the Center Median, at the Entrance.
- 2. New Bench at the Pool Entry area, and New Planting Pots at Pool Stairs.
- 3. Decided to Drop the idea of a HPOA community Garden, Due to Insufficient Daylight in the area to support healthy crops.
- The area is low-lying with a higher ridge of trees to the south. This creates a shade barrier and prevents sunlight from reaching all areas of the clearing for a sustained period of time. Therefore the area with the most sun exposure in this clearing by the pool receives <5 hours of sunlight/day. Fruit-bearing plants require "full sun" to support the production of fruit.
- Because this clearing is not in full sun during the growing season, it is not recommended that it be used for a community garden. Sorry folks.

While the idea of the community garden garnered enough support from neighbors, it was still controversial. Landscape Committee Surveyed all 79 Households: 18 Never responded, 20 responded No they did not want a community Garden, 41 Responded as supporting the idea or were interested in a plot. But People Surveyed did not want the garden within the current fenced area of the Pool, which we had originally proposed.
