HARRISON PLACE POLLINATORS ARE COMING OUT - Don't Fret

You may have noticed in your yard or a neighbor's yard, many mounds of dirt, small clay looking mounds. I thought we were being invaded by something, and should we be concerned?

To ease my mind, I reached out to our resident Master Gardener Kristin Klett, a member of our Landscape Committee, to see if she could explain what this might be. Kristin replied "I am so glad you asked and would be thrilled if our neighborhood newsletter could mention the mounds! They are solitary, ground-nesting bees and they are GOOD! I know their mounds look scary. They freaked me out the first time I saw them, too! Most of the bee species are ground-nesters (more than 70%), and because they are solitary, they are not aggressive. These native bees are important pollinators for our ecosystem. I have watched their nests emerge over the last several Springs in Harrison Place. I think we have an exceptional population in some neighbors' yards! This year, though - they emerged early, the nests will go away with the next heavy rain - some will come back, but bees will not need them much longer. They are getting some free aeration services from Mother Nature. :) "
