
FRONT YARD TREE REPLACEMENT SUGGESTIONS

As most of you have probably noticed while driving in the community, most of the front yard trees planted by the builder have not done well. The majority of these trees are dead, dying or just unsightly. Some are not even ideal plants to have in such a small space as the root systems on some trees can cause damage to water and utility lines plus walkways and driveways.

The HOA is formally requesting that all owners evaluate the condition of these trees in each respective lot. If your tree needs to be removed and replaced, below are some suggestions that are native to our area - and have smaller / less invasive root systems. The HOA would encourage all owners to make plans now to replace these plants this fall when seasonally appropriate.

Japanese Maple - offers a brilliant fall display



Crape myrtle- popular choice for homeowners



Kousa dogwood - known for non-invasive roots



Eastern Redbuds - great for pollinators
